# 2. DISCUSSED:

Discussion took place on retaining third party consultant regarding evaluation on SBAC results, the consultant to research and advise on whether setting accountability percentages on reaching proficiency levels in SBACs improves outcomes. Consultant would also assess curriculum needs, including instructional time analysis and patterns emerging from data analysis. Mrs. Enright reported feeling strongly on setting these accountability measures. Dr. Alexander suggested that information gathering take place first and through rich discussion, all were in agreement that information gathering would include: Dr. Melendez and Mrs. Snowden will consult with EdAdvance, the Tristate Consortium and the State Education Resource Center for the purposes of how other districts have gone about setting SBAC targets, how these districts achieved targets and the impact on the district. Mrs. Enright cautioned that information gathering on other districts should include wide range and from large to small and should include districts that have similar situation with low SBAC scores.

Dr. Melendez and Mrs. Snowden agreed to report on this information in New Year and Board will determine need for consultant at that time.
