Students who behave in a safe, non-threatening way and who show respect for self, others, property and educational environment will never have to worry about violating this code.

The Sherman Public School System promotes: discipline as education, discipline with caring, primary prevention, early intervention, development of self discipline, consistency and predictability, celebration of good behavior, celebration of achievement and sense of school "community".

Definitions

Harassment: conduct which annoys, threatens, intimidates, or causes fear direct at a member of a potential class based on race, color, national origin, religion, gender, disability, sexual orientation or gender identity; unwanted behavior that offends, demeans, or threatens another person causing a hostile environment.

Relational Aggression: using friendship for power, i.e. ignoring some to punish them or to get one's way.

Sexual Harassment: unwelcoming sexual advances, gestures or jokes.

Racial or discriminatory slurs: insulting comments made about a person's race, sex, physical appearance or other personal characteristics.

Insubordination: willful disrespect for authority.

Vandalism: willful destruction of public or private property.

Truancy: unexcused absences up to 10 days in any school year.

Instigation, Intimidation: frightening or forcing someone into submission or obedience.

Theft: taking or attempting to take personal property or money from another by force or fear.

Fighting: with another person on school premises not reasonably necessary for self defense.

Assault: unprovoked hitting or striking.

Extortion: attempting to get something from a person by

Trespassing: infringing on property, territory or rights of another

Physical Aggression: unprovoked hitting or striking based on the severity of the particular behavior and the student's disciplinary history, the administration will assign consequences ranging between the minimum and the maximum stated in the code

Bullying: repeated intentional aggressive acts/interactions between individuals (with different levels of social power).

Cyberbullying: bullying through email, texting, instant messaging, in a chat room, on a website, or through digital messages or images sent to any electronic devices.

Tardy: arrival after 8:25 AM.

Cyber Threat: Sending or posting of direct threats or distressing material that raises concern that an individual may contemplating a violent act.

Keys to Terminology

Appropriate Staff Response: Discipline without administrative intervention. This may include such things as conferences, parent contacts, warnings, detentions, loss of privileges, removal from class, etc.

CC: Case Conference

Planning Placement Team (PPT): Referral to Planing and Placement Team (students in special education)

Anti-Harassment Team (AHT): School Climate Specialists, School Counselor, School Psychologist and Teacher.

Refer to School Based Counseling (SBC): Student will meet with School Counselor or School Psychologist.

Parent contact will occur in instances below and a referral will be made to school counseling.

ISS: In-School Suspension (up to 5 days)

OSS: Out of School Suspension

Expulsion: Referral to the Superintendent for possible recommendation that the BOE expel up to one calendar year. (*PPT decisions may supersede this process.*)

Police Report: May include arrest

Consistent with Board of Education Policy, the Board of Education believes that teaching learning proceed best in a safe, respectful and orderly environment. Toward that end, the Sherman School shall implement positive approaches to promoting and maintaining appropriate behavior. Also toward that end, the school will adopt, implement and annually distribute codes of conduct which specify the range of possible consequences including, but not limited to, particular types of misbehavior. These positive approaches and conduct codes must be consistent with State and Federal law, Board policies and the following principles:

- communication/alliance with family
- safety for all
- respect for self and others
- respect for personal public property
- courtesy
- cultural sensitivity
- respect for differences
- balance between rights and responsibilities
- balance between the rights of the individual and the rights of the total school community.

Additional Board polices and administrative regulations exist. These describe in detail procedures to be followed in response to particular kinds of behaviors. Copies are available upon request through the Superintendent's office. Examples: truancy, suspension and expulsion, harassment, weapons, bus misbehavior, removal from class, exclusion from privileges, dress and grooming.
